### CONFESSIONS FOR HOLY SOULS NOVENA

After 10.30 Mass on this Sun  
After 8.00 Vigil Mass on Thurs  
After 10.30 Mass on All Saints  
After both Masses on next Sat

2nd November – Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls From 12 o'clock noon on 1st November until midnight on 2nd November, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion, and prayed for the Pope's intentions (one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice) can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church or oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed.

This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed. Confession may be made at any time within the week preceding or the week following 1st November. Holy Communion may be received on any day from 1st November to 8th November.

The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1st to 8th November. The conditions mentioned above apply also for this.

October: Month of the Rosary  
The Rosary is recited in Kilbriain church every morning before Mass

Novena for the Holy Souls  
Starts on Sat 2nd November and ends on Sun 10th. There will be two Masses each weekday, at 9.00 and 8.00 pm, as well as the scheduled weekend Masses.

Envelopes are available in the sacristy now for distribution.

The 8.00 pm Novena Mass on Fri week, Nov 8th, will be commemorating those who died during the past 12 months and praying for bereaved families.
