Reflection on Scripture

Today's second reading celebrates the indwelling presence of the Spirit. When Jesus imparted his Spirit to each of his followers, they became temples of the Spirit and when he

died for their sins, Jesus won them as his own possession. In addition to being possessed by the Spirit and Jesus in these ways, believers are invited to get to know the Lord so well that they begin to have the mind of Christ', the same attitudes that Jesus has so that they act as the Lord would act in every situation. As a result of all believers uniting themselves to Jesus, the collective body of believers becomes one in thought, word and action The author of today's reading says that believers who belong to God in this profound way, ought to glorify and serve the Lord with their bodies. The writer warns against a rash use of their bodies for unsightly pleasures, since the Christians no longer belong to themselves, and their spiritual union with one another supersedes any physical union. In addition to this they ought to respect their bodies because someday the God who raised Jesus from the dead will also raise up everyone united to Jesus, through the power of the Spirit dwelling in each of them
