Today's First Reading

Amos, the prophet from Tekoa was active in Israel at a time of prosperity and fullness. He was very conscious of the unjust attitude of many of his fellow countrymen and experienced God as threatening to destroy the Northern Kingdom of Israel on account of their hardness of heart. The wealthy folk had disregarded the stipulations of the Covenant, which bound them to their poorer neighbours as brothers. Instead of extending a helping hand to them in their need the wealthy are ready to take usury from them and to extort their debts, even to the extent of selling people into slavery. But the 'Pride of Jacob', an ancient title for God, will not forget and God's memory is an active faculty.

Amos, possibly the first of the writing prophets, has a message that is perennially valid. It is the message of God's condemnation of human greed and of the exploitation of the weak. Amos wrote in an age of great contrasts. There was the great affluence of those who lived in stone houses panelled in wood and ivory; there was the wretchedness of the poor who were helpless and exploited. Then, as now, the single-minded pursuit of wealth could lead to the shunting of religion into a siding and to the blunting of one's conscience with regard to justice.
