Bambinelli Sunday

Bambinelli Sunday is a beautiful tradition that was started by Pope St. John Paul II. Bambinelli is Italian, the plural of bambinello which means "little baby [boy]." Bambinelli Sunday is celebrated on Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent. Thousands of people come to St. Peter's Square bringing the Baby Jesus figurines from their cribs and nativity scenes; then, at the time of the Pope's Angelus address, he blesses all the little figures of the Child Jesus. Following a suggestion from the Diocesan Liturgical Ofice, we hope to bring this tradition to Kilbrittain. On next Sunday week, 11th December (Gaudete Sunday) you are invited to bring the figure of the Baby Jesus for your crib to Mass on Saturday night or Sunday to have it blessed. After the blessing take it home and gift-wrap it until Christmas Eve. Let it be the first Christmas gift you unwrap before putting it in the crib.

First Sunday of Advent, Year A

Today marks the beginning of the Church's liturgical Year. Each season has its special grace and today we begin the season of Advent in which we prepare for Christmas and await with expectant longing for God to be born again into our lives, our families, our Church and our world.

Saint Augustine summed up the mood of this season well when he prayed: 'You have made us for yourself, O God, and our hearts are restless till they rest in you'. Our hearts are made for

God. Our souls long for communion with God. During Advent we are meant to taste this restlessness and this longing, to take stock of our lives, to check our direction and to await with expectation the special grace that God promises to offer us at Christmas.

Many of the Advent readings recall the longing of generation after generation of the people of ancient Israel, who experienced a special covenant with God and who longed for the Messiah whom they believed God would send them. We Christians believe that God fulfilled that promise in the person of Mary's child who said to his friends: 'Many have longed to see what you see and never saw it, to hear what you hear and never heard it' (Luke 10:24).

Whatever else we might do in preparation for Christmas, let us not forget Jesus' coming. Let us renew our resolve not to be distracted from it by all the razzmatazz that surrounds what has become largely a secular holiday with little or no reference to Jesus.
