The Secret Messiah

In a way that is typical of Mark's Gospel, Jesus attempts to perform today's miracle in as secluded a way as possible. He takes the man away from the crowd and performs the healing gestures in private. After the healing, he strictly tells all those around to say nothing of it. He does not want the crowds to conclude that he is the Messiah from acts such as these. His messianic identity must be kept a secret for the time being. It is only to be revealed in conjunction with his destiny to suffer and die upon the cross. Otherwise, the people will see him entirely in terms of conventional messianic expectation, which had a large element of political leadership bound up with it. As in John 6:15, they will want

to take him away and make him their king. Such a messianic role would be totally at odds with the path set out for him by the Father, which is to be the Son of Man who has come "not to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many" (10:45).
