

## Who should be listening?

One of the main resolutions to emerge from the Bishops' Youth Synod in Rome last month was, rather predictably, that the Church should listen to our young people. Here in Ireland our children are anointed Priest, Prophet and King at their Baptism and confirmed in the Holy Spirit at their Confirmation, all before they reach adolescence. So they are not lacking in qualifications of a Divine nature. However,

being an active young Catholic involves cultivating those gifts by absorbing the Church's teachings as they grow up, meeting Jesus frequently in the Sacraments of the Mass and Confession and, with prayer and humility, trying to see what God is asking them to do in each important situation and even in life itself. This wouldn't describe all of our youth.

One can only too clearly envisage the Irish Church, in the hope of getting positive headlines from mocking media, pandering to those empty vessels, Godless sons and daughters of Godless parents, who make up a significant and vocal proportion of under-30s throughout the country.

In contrast, a Voice of the Family conference of active Catholic youth, some from Ireland reflecting the other side of the coin among their peers, also in Rome last month asked the following of bishops:

- > To be told the truth, not a watereddown version of it.
- > Protect our Catholic tradition because that is what Our Lord would want. He knows better than we do.
- > Do not listen to the world, but rather allow the world to listen to Christ.
- > We do not want the faith to be handing on to us what the world is handing on to us. We want to have the unique truth that is found only in the Church.

When the time for listening comes, would that bishops only lend an ear to those who have been listening themselves first!
