EUCHARISTIC ADORA N: Mon 9 to 1; Wed 2 to 8 offertory envelope, or envelopes, within the past three years. This means we can associate a box number with a particular person or family. We also get envelopes back where the donor hasn't supplied a name to associate with a number. We are grateful for these anonymous donations as well and, of course, for the money put in the collection basket without using an envelope.

There is a good supply of unallocated boxes available in the porches. If you would like to use the numbered envelopes anonymously please take a box. If you would like to be included among the registered donors, write your name and address on one envelope at least during the year and that number will be allocated to you for the foreseeable future.

Every envelope received, whether identifiable or anonymous, is entered by number and amount by Fr Cremin alone. Collectors write the amount on each envelope as it is opened and the envelopes are then used by Fr Cremin to enter the amount corresponding to each envelope number each week in a database. Only Fr Cremin has control of the list which identifies which name is associated with any envelope number.

Because most of the envelopes given out don't come back, and because of the cost of envelopes, we have been scaling back the quantities ordered each year and this year our order was for 450. This means that people who had envelope numbers greater than 450 have been allocated new numbers, taken from unused numbers down the list. Be assured that these numbers have never been allocated to anybody else, eliminating the danger of your donation being wrongly attributed.

# BETHLEHEM PEACE LIGHT

Each Christmas our local Scouts bring us the Bethlehem Peace Light. What is the Peace Light?

In early December each year, a candle is lit in the Church of the Nativity, in Bethlehem. This flame is taken by Palestinian and Israeli Scouts to Tel Aviv Airport where is flown to Austria. From Vienna, Scouts transport it across Europe and beyond. In the week before Christmas, there will be Light distribution services across Ireland. Our Scouts are taking part is this as usual and they will bring the flame to Kilbrittain for the Vigil Mass on Sat 22nd December.

This year the Scouts have acquired mini lanterns for use of those who would like to take the flame to their homes. They are being made available at  $\cos t - \epsilon 5$  — and samples can be seen on the side altar this weekend. We have 20 available and more can be ordered if we are approached early enough.

### **BAMBINELLI SUNDAY**

Bambinelli Sunday is a beautiful tradition that was started by Pope St. John Paul II. Bambinelli is Italian, the plural of bambinello which means "little baby [boy]." Bambinelli Sunday is celebrated on Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent. Thousands of people come to St. Peter's Square bringing the Baby Jesus figurines from their cribs and nativity scenes; then, at the time of the Pope's Angelus address, he blesses all the little figures of the Child Jesus. We have copied this tradition for the last two years in Kilbrittain.
