Belief in the Real Presence

Seven in ten U.S. Catholics don't believe the Blessed Sacrament is Christ, according to a recent Pew Research poll.

It's being called a crisis of faith. Few bishops acknowledge it, and fewer bishops seem to even care. One bishop is pushing back —Bishop. Daniel Jenky of Peoria, Illinois. Bishop Jenky made headlines this year for bringing back to Peoria the body of Archbishop Fulton Sheen, who was devoted to daily adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Bishop Jenky blamed the loss of faith on a pervasive lack of reverence. Some churches seem "more like hotel lobbies than an awesome House of God," said Bishop Jenky.

He wants to rekindle the Faith by restoring practices that include:

- Keeping silence in church
- Genuflecting
- Kneeling
- Centering of tabernacles
- Use of bells and multiple candles on the altar
- Praying before and after Mass

Portland's Archbishop Alexander Sample also believes that faith will only follow reverence.

Citing Archbishop Fulton Sheen in his reaction to the poll in August, Archbishop Sample says, "'If you don't behave as you believe, you will end by believing as you behave."

Archbishop Sample and Bishop Jenky are in line with faithful Catholics who see restoring eucharistic reverence as imperative to restoring eucharistic faith. But with more than 400 bishops in the United States, the question is how many others will follow suit.
