### Feast of Immaculate Conception NOT a Holy Day of Obligation this year

When the 8th December falls on a weekday, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception is a Holy Day of Obligation, as most of us already know! What happens when a Holy Day of Obligation falls on a Sunday? In most cases, the prayers and readings of the Sunday are replaced by those of the Feast, as happened with 6th January (Epiphany) and 17th March (St Patrick) this year. However, an Advent Sunday is too important to interfere with – 8th December will be the 2nd Sunday of Advent -- so the Feast Day readings and prayers will be transferred to Monday (9th), but that day will not be a Holy Day of Obligation. I had several queries in regard to this and so had the Diocesan Office, with the result that we received an email to clarify the situation.

*On a related theme, you will find two envelopes in your boxes marked 8th December, one for the 2nd Sunday of Advent and one for the Immaculate Conception. THIS IS AN ERROR, YOU ONLY NEED TO RETURN ONE OF THEM (it doesn't matter which).*
