ST PATRICK'S CHURCH,

Corpus Christi

Sunday next, June 6th. Instead of the procession of normal times, it is proposed to have the Blessed Sacrament carried through the village on the back of the jeep as was done last year. We didn't announce this beforehand last year because of the uncertainty about the way people would gather and the unfamiliarity with the degree of caution necessary.

By this time, restrictions have eased somewhat and, more importantly, everybody understands and follows behaviour for best practice now. Recent funerals have shown that very large numbers can be safely accommodated when standing in reverence along the street, numbers far larger than we expect for the procession. Please be aware, though, that the church can only accommodate a very small

number and for this reason please try to stick to your townland zone for the Sunday Mass, even though it may be tempting to combine Mass and procession.

The procession will begin at **12.00** noon, not directly after Mass. It will take the same route as last year: Past the cemetery, turn around at Gortnahorna, pause at the grotto, turn back at the Village Park, detour to Castle View and Meadow View and return to the church for Benediction.

All this depends on suitable weather. As an alternative, a blesing will be given from the top of the church steps after Mass.

Eucharistic Adoration

There will be Eucharistic Adoration on next Sunday, Corpus Christi, from 1.00 pm to 8.00 pm, finishing with Benediction. Adorers are invited to sign up for individual hours. For this, there will be a clipboard in front of the altar all the week and people can also text, email or FB message their choice of hour to Fr Cremin. As last year. a Facebook post will be kept updated with numbers signing up for each hour as the week goes on.

It is hoped to return to regular weekly Adoration, (Mon 9.30 to 1; Wed 2 to 8) on Monday week, 7th June. Adorers are asked to resume their rotas.
