### Bambinelli Sunday

Bring the figure of the Baby Jesus for your crib to Mass next Saturday night or Sunday morning to have it blessed. This tradition was started by Pope Francis. After the blessing take it home and gift-wrap it until Christmas Eve. (If the figure in your crib is not standalone or awkward to bring, you can bring the Star of Bethlehem from your crib or Christmas tree or any nativity figure or scene.)
