This year we have the added burden of a deep recession. Most people are finding their livelihood reduced considerably. We are bemused by the commentaries of the "experts" and the wide variety of solutions being put forward. We pray that the Government will make considered and wise decisions in the interest of the whole community and especially the most vulnerable.

One commentator mentioned that during the boom years we seemed to have got rid of the begrugery that was so common in Ireland. He also wondered if it were coming back again. I hope not. A recession like so many difficult situations or even disasters can bring out the best in people. We can hope that having shared the good times, even if rather unevenly, we can be generous in our sharing in the changed times.

During the boom years many people felt that we had become in some sense, very materialistic, that we had almost lost our soul. Certainly there seems to have been a decline in spiritual values. During that time there has been a marked drop in church attendance. Still in the midst of all that when we met a very difficult situation here in Kilbrittain huge numbers rallied around to help and a great crowd came to pray for Ann when we laid her to rest. This was repeated all over the country when other communities had their own misfortune. It is particularly heartening to see so many young people gathering to pray in such difficult situations.

Trocaire

The response to the **Trocaire Lenten Campaign** this year yielded €1,680.00. A grateful "thank you" to all who contributed. The figure was down about €300.00 on last years figure. The contribution has been falling slightly each year for the past four years. However the contribution has been very generous over these years.

It is sad to see in the Irish Catholic that Trocaire are pulling out of four countries this year. This is due to a cut of 20% in government funding and a shortfall of 10% in donations from the public. The report says "This is the worst crisis the funding agency has ever experienced". They anticipate an earlier that planned withdrawal from five other countries in the coming years.
