7 Sacraments

What is a Sacrament?
A Sacrament is an outward, visible sign instituted by Jesus Christ that gives the grace it signifies.

The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life."

The Ten Commandments
1. You shall worship the Lord your God and Him only shall you serve.
2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
3. Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy.
4. Honor your mother and father.
5. You shall not kill.
6. You shall not commit adultery.
7. You shall not steal.
8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

The Two Greatest Commandment
You shall love God with your whole heart, your whole soul, and your whole mind.
You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic.

Three Eminent Good Works
Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving.

Chastity, Poverty, and Obedience

The Seven Capital Sins and their Opposite Virtues
1. Pride - Humility
2. Avarice - Generosity
3. Lust - Chastity
4. Anger - Meekness
5. Gluttony - Temperance
6. Envy - Brotherly Love
7. Sloth - Diligence

Apostle Creed
I believe in God the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, in Jesus Christ his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried, He descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, sits at the right hand of God the Father almighty from there he shall come to judge the living and the dead. The Corporal Works of Mercy

To admonish the sinner, instruct the ignorant, counsel the doubtful, comfort the sorrowful, bear wrongs patiently, forgive all injuries, and pray for the living and the dead.

The Precepts of the Church
1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
2. You shall confess your sins once a year.
3. You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
4. You shall observe the fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
5. You shall provide for the need of the poor.
6. You shall observe the laws of the Church.

The Beatitudes
1. Blessed are the poor in spirit; for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven.
2. Blessed are the meek; for they shall possess the land.
3. Blessed are they that mourn; for they shall be comforted.
4. Blessed are they that hunger and thirst for justice; for they shall be filled.
5. Blessed are the merciful; for they shall obtain mercy.
6. Blessed are the pure of heart; for they shall see God.
7. Blessed are the peace-makers; for they shall be called the children of God.
8. Blessed are they that suffer persecution for justice's sake; for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven.
