When Pentecost came – 50 days after Jesus had risen from the dead and 10 days after he had ascended to heaven – the apostles were “filled with the Holy Spirit,” as he had promised.

“Just as the body is one and has many members [or organs],” St. Paul says, “and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body.”

That body is the Church. She is not just an assembly (in Greek, ekklesia) of believers gathered around Christ. She is a body, with Christ as her head, the Holy Spirit as her soul, and us as her members.

The one Spirit gives the body's members a variety of gifts to fit them for a variety of activities and services, St. Paul says. Our “proper functioning” in Christ's mystical body, then, means our functioning according to the gifts the Holy Spirit bestows on us and the activities he inspires in us.

As organs in Christ's mystical body, we are each unique, but we are not separate. Through the Holy Spirit, “all the parts of the body are joined one with the other and with their exalted head,” says the Catechism.
