Bishop Gavin this week issued a pastoral letter entitled 'Putting Out Into Deep Waters'. A printed

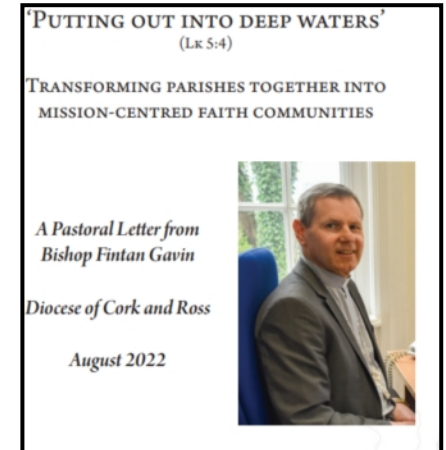

#### Capt Hugh Thornton Centenary

100 years ago, this weekend Captain Hugh Thornton of the National Army was accidentally shot (by accidental discharge of a rifle) while travelling in an armoured car on active service from Bantry to Skibbereen on 27 August 1922. He was 24 years old. A native of Drogheda, Co. Louth, Thornton fought in the GPO during the Easter Rising. After the Rising in 1916 he was sent to West Cork as Volunteer Organiser and made Kilbrittain his headquarters for a few years whilst training local Volunteers including Kilbrittain Company. He helped lay the foundations of the Cork Third Brigade.

During the War of Independence, he served as Vice-Commandant of Cork Third Brigade in 1919 and later as Intelligence Officer of the 2nd Battalion, Dublin Brigade, IRA.

Captain Thornton was interred in the National Army Plot surrounding Michael Collin's grave in Glasnevin Cemetery. Ar dheis Dé go raibh an anam.
