History Tour

Kilbrittain Historical Society's third outdoor event of the year takes place Saturday 15th October. This outing is an exciting full-day bus outing to Kerry on 'The War of Independence & Civil War in Kerry'. Leaving Kilbrittain at 8.45am sharp and returning at approximately 9pm later that night. We will be going on a guided historical bus tour given by local historian & society member, Con McCarthy. Con will be guiding us through the parts of North-West Cork and throughout Kerry covering significant War of Independence & Civil War ambush sites. The outing includes a visit to Carrigaphooa Bridge, Macroom, Drishane Train Ambush Monument near Millstreet, Clonbanin, tea & coffee stop at Rathmore, Castleisland, dinner in Knocknagoshel Community Centre, onto Ballyseedy monument in Tralee, Causeway, Countess Bridge, Headford Train Ambush site on the way home from Killarney. The cost of the bus will be €30 each filled on a first-come-first-served basis. It would be appreciated if people can bring a Hi-Vis vest/jacket with them.

Volunteer Daniel O'Donovan

Since 2020, and despite the Covid restrictions, we have been celebrating the successive centenaries of local deaths and engagements during the War of Independence and the Civil War. October 4th last marked the centenary of the final local death, that of Volunteer Daniel O'Donovan of Cloghagh Compaty (aged 34) who was killed at the Kilbrittain end of Timoleague Bridge when the bridge collapsed on him while it was being demolished. His name is inscribed in the Celtic cross which stands over the Republican Plot in our churchyard.
