#### **Online Lenten Retreat**

The Priory Institute, run by Irish Dominicans, are delighted to offer a Free of Charge Online Lenten Retreat featuring a series of online reflections given in preparation for Easter.

The Retreat Giver is Seán Goan is a retired teacher and biblical scholar who studied Scripture in Rome, Jerusalem and in the University of Chicago.

The course consists of four recorded presentations that will become available over the six Sundays of Lent ending on Palm Sunday, so on the first Sunday there will be access to one recording and on the second Sunday access to two recordings and so on. ## **Today's Readings**

The first reading, taken from the book of Leviticus, gives the Holiness code: "Be holy, for I, the Lord, your God, am Holy." It also gives us the way to share God's holiness: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 103) challenges us to be like our God – kind, merciful and forgiving — and it shows us the measure of perfection Christ asks us to bring to our relationships.

In the second reading, St. Paul gives us an additional reason to be holy. We are to keep our bodies holy because we are the temples of the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit lives in us.

In the Gospel passage Jesus confirms, corrects, and expands the Ten Commandments. For Jesus, retaliation, or even limited vengeance, has no place in the Christian life, even though graceful acceptance of an offense requires great strength and discipline of character, as well as strengthening by God's grace. The second part of today's Gospel passage presents the Christian ethic of personal relationships: love one's neighbors and forgive one's enemies. We are commanded to love our enemies as Jesus loves us, not because our enemies deserve our love. but because Jesus loves them so much that he died for them as he did for us.
