Easter Sunday's Gospel

Today's Gospel from John draws our attention to the empty tomb as the sign of Jesus' resurrection to life. It was the first day after Sabbath, first day of the Christian week when Mary Magdalene came to the tomb of Jesus. It was a Jewish custom to visit the tomb of the beloved departed at least for three days after the burial. As she approached the tomb she saw the stone rolled back and wondered who could have removed such a heavy stone. She immediately ran to the disciples to inform the matter of the missing body of the Lord. She reported the matter to Peter who was already accepted as the Leader of the group. Peter and the disciple whom Jesus loved run to the tomb. They saw the entire scene, they understood and they believed in the act of the resurrection.
