Today's Gospel

When the risen Lord joined the two disciples, he first invited them to tell him what they had been talking about. He wanted to listen to their story in all its sadness and despondency. He wanted to be with them, as they were. He respected where they were on their journey. That is how the Lord is present to us. He meets us where we are. He invites us to be honest with him, to share what is in our hearts, what is on our minds. It was only after listening carefully to the two disciples that the stranger spoke. When he spoke, it was to place their sad, hopeless, story in a whole new light. He told them a bigger story from the Scriptures; it was a story that didn't end in death but in glory; it was a story full of hope, about how the promised Messiah would suffer, yes, but would then enter into his glory. He lifted the story of the two disciples into this bigger story of God's faithful love. God's love was revealed most powerfuuly in the sending of his Son so that we might have life and have it to the full. The words of the stranger rekindled the hope of the disciples, as they said, 'Did not our hearts burn within us as he talked to us on the road?'
