Today's Scripture

Our Scripture readings call us to preach Christ through our words and lives without fear. The **First Reading** tells us how the prophet Jeremiah trusted in the power of God while he faced opposition in his prophetic ministry. The psalmist in today's **Responsorial Psalm** (Ps 69) displays the same trust in the kindness and great mercy of God when he is misunderstood and ill-treated even by his brothers and relatives. In the **Second Reading**, Paul assures the Christians in Rome that they need not be afraid of opposition both because they share in the death of Jesus and his Resurrection and because they are united with Christ in his Resurrection. In today's **Gospel** Jesus instructs the apostles to live simply and to expect opposition and rejection. They are to proclaim the Gospel boldly because they will be protected. The readings hint at the opposition the Apostles themselves would meet, and we future Christians will encounter as we carry on the work of Jesus in the world, and they encourage us to persevere in doing the work of Jesus. They assure us that we will be successful despite the opposition we encounter.
