# Death of Kilbrittain Clerical Student 70 years ago this week.



Liam Berkery was the son Of Sgt John Berkery and his wife Jean Teresa Nolan, Kilbrittain Garda Station. As a Farranferris Student he attended the Diocesan Irish College in Brú na Gráige, Dún Chaoin, regularly. After his Leaving Cert he went on to study for the priesthood in Clonliffe College, Dublin. During the Summer at the end of his first year he returned to Brú na Gráige. While there he was lost while swimming from the nearby Clocher Beach on 10th August 1953. His body wasn't discovered until the 26th August. He was found by a farmer on Caslegregory Beach, about 45 Km away by sea. The family were relieved that his remains were retrieved and he was laid to rest in St Corban's Cemetery, Naas, close to his mother's childhood home.

At a concelebrated Mass in Brú na Gráige on Sunday 30th July last, commemorating the centenary of the end of the Civil War, Liam was remembembered in special prayers.
