Today's Parable

Since a wedding was a great occasion, the whole village lined up at the sides of the road to wish God's blessings on the bride being taken in procession by her groom to her new home. The invited ones would join the procession, which started from the bride's house and moved to the groom's house, to take part in the week-long celebration of the marriage. Since the bridegroom might come to the bride's house unexpectedly, the bridal party had to be ready at any time, with accompanying virgins (bridesmaids in our day), carrying lighted torches and jars of reserve oil. Five of these virgins neglected to bring reserve oil, and so had to run to the dealers to buy some. They missed the arrival of the groom's party, and so, lost their chance to take part in the celebration. They lost not only the opportunity of witnessing the marriage ceremony, but also of participating in the week-long celebration that followed.
