Pointers for Prayer

1 Jesus leads the woman along a
wonderful journey towards a deeper
and fuller life. You can enter the story
with Jesus, the ideal teacher. Notice
how he meets the woman where she is,
needing her assistance, how he is
patient with her, but also challenges her
to grow to what she is capable of.

2 You can also enter the story from
the perspective of the woman's
journey. Notice the steps along the
way: suspicion, distrust, curiosity,
misunderstanding and conversion. Her
journey was one in which a very human
motivation attracted her to Jesus: the
thought of having water in such a way
that she did not have to come and draw
it from the well. What have been the
human motives that have attracted you

to faith, prayer, religion, church and
which have been stepping-stones to a
deeper personal relationship with
Jesus? Perhaps we can also see the
same movement in the growth of some
of our human relationships.

3 The woman's final tactic is to
attempt to buy time before
responding —it will all happen
sometime in the future Jesus points out
that the time for a faith response is
NOW. How have you discovered the
importance of the NOW
moment?

O God, living and true, look upon
your people, whose dry and stony
hearts are parched with thirst.
Unseal the living water of your
Spirit; let it become within us an
every-flowing spring, leaping up to
eternal life.
