Thought for the day

As we approach Holy Week and
begin to celebrate "the great events of
our salvation," it is timely to reflect in
a more focused way on our faith in
Jesus. Who is Jesus? What are we
celebrating in Holy Week? We can
begin to trace our response with the
help of today's reading from John and
especially in the 'I AM' sentences of
that Gospel. The historical Jesus was
guarded in declaring his identity but

by the time the Fourth Gospel was
written, Christians had arrived at a
rich understanding of the mystery of
Jesus, the Son of God. John's Gospel
puts before the believer a grand array
of 'I AM' sentences, rooted in the
name of God in
Exodus 3:14, I am who I am. I am the
bread of life. (John 6:35, 48, 51); I
am the light of the world (John 8:12;
9:5); I am the gate for the sheep
(John 10:7, 9); I am the good
shepherd (John 10:11, 14); I am the
resurrection and the life (John
11:25); I am the way, and the truth,
and the life (John 14:6); I am the
true vine (John 15:1, 5). Altogether, it
is a resounding reminder that we
believe first of all in a person, not in a
philosophy. Anyone one of these
images would take us deeply into our
encounter with the Risen Lord, none
more so than "I am the resurrection
and the life" (John 11:25).

Prayer

Jesus, present to us always, you
wept at the tomb of your friend
Lazarus. As we face the mystery of
death, our own and that of those we
love, help us build our faith on your
resurrection from the dead
