THURSDAY NEXT, JUNE 24TH Feast of the Nativity of St John the Baptist

We celebrated the Annunciation on March 25th, recalling the Virginal Conception of Jesus, because it is nine months before Christmas Day. At the Annunciation, the Angel Gabriel also told Mary that her Cousin Elizabeth was in her sixth month with John the Baptist so we celebrate his birth three months after the Annunciation.

Apart from Jesus himself and his Blessed Mother, St John the Baptist is the only person to have two major Feasts in the annual calendar: his birthday on June 24th and his beheading on August 29th.

June 24th has been celebrated as a religious and social festival for over 1,500 years with different traditions and customs developing in every country in Europe and, later on, in the Americas.

Celebrating the birth of St. John the Baptist is a Feast that is relevant to all of us today. Just like St. John, we would do well to "leap" with joy in announcing Jesus to all those we encounter in our world. We can do this in everything we do – not just by words, but by actions. Asking for St. John's intercession on this the Feast of his birth, we can draw the strength necessary to proclaim our Lord to others.
