Corpus Christi

As announced last week, the Blessed Sacrament will leave the church at **12.00 noon**, *not* directly after Mass. It will take the same route as last year: Past the cemetery, turn around at Gortnahorna, pause at the grotto, turn back at the Village Park, detour to Castle View and Meadow View and return to the church. **Sadly, to avoid too many people wanting to come into the church afterwards, there will not be Benediction at this point.** The blessing is imparted along the route to the people and the parish. Benediction Liturgy will conclude the all-day adoration at 8.00 pm. All this depends on suitable weather. As an alternative, a blessing will be given from the top of the church steps after Mass.

Eucharistic Adoration

There will be Eucharistic Adoration from 1.00 pm to 8.00 pm, finishing with Benediction.

Weekly Adoration

Because this Monday is a Bank Holiday, the return to weekly adoration has been postponed until the following Monday, June 14th. Adorers are asked to resume their rotas if possible.
